## How To Use This Book

## Icons Used In This Book



This icon indicates very important information that you really should pay attention to and perhaps even tattoo on your chest (backwards, of course, so you won't be confused when you see it in the mirror).



This nerd (I AM NOT A NERD! Oops, sorry, knee-jerk reaction there.) appears beside discussions that aren't critical if you just want to learn basic concepts and get answers to your WrestleMania party questions. (Admit it – you DO have questions!) These sections aren't mandatory reading, but they will deepen and enhance your WrestleMania party knowledge. And isn't that what life is really all about?



This classy symbol indicates information that will make you have to leave the main WrestleMania party area and walk out into the host's backyard to clear your head.



This target flags strategy recommendations for making the most of your WrestleMania party experience (such as, *don't sit next to that one creepy guy*).



This icon indicates that you are about to read something that will blow your mind so much that you will swear on a stack of pancakes that you're seeing a pig doing an impression of The Fonz.



This icon is a friendly reminder of WrestleMania party information discussed elsewhere in the book, or something that you'll definitely want to remember (such as, *never attend a WrestleMania party again*).



These people running away indicate that you are about to read an excuse that the host will believe as to why you can't make the party or have to leave early. (NOTE: Saying in the first five minutes, "I didn't think this was REALLY going to be a party to observe WrestleMania" is no longer considered a valid excuse.)



This icon points out items to avoid and common mistakes people make when attending WrestleMania parties. It can also indicate that a YUPPY is about to embarrass himself by pretending to be street smart and calling something "da bomb!"



Let's face it; attending a WrestleMania party is not for the weak of heart, stomach, soul, or chin. So when you see this icon, or the actions that it speaks of, this would probably be a really good time to, as the Surgeon General calls it, "get funky like a monkey." And if your party neighbors look a little squeamish, feel free to slip a little something in their bloodstream, too.



This icon alerts you to scams and scoundrels that prey on the unsuspecting at WrestleMania parties. The author strongly suggests that to avoid any possible problems, you immediately hand all of your valuables over to the WrestleMania party host as soon as you arrive. He will take care of them for you, and they will be returned to you promptly at the next year's party.

## WrestleMania Parties Throughout The Years



This year's WrestleMania party will be the 13<sup>th</sup> one that Mike has hosted – his 10<sup>th</sup> party in San Francisco after 3 triumphant bashes in Boston. Prior to that, believe it or not, there is no record anywhere of anyone ever having thrown a WrestleMania party! In fact, in some history books, Mike is actually credited with inventing this genre of party. And while he appreciates his part in the development of this art form, Mike really is just content with the knowledge that he helped to fill a gap in what was once a WrestleMania-related void. As he says, “I’m just doing it for the children.”

While it would take too long to review all of the legal paperwork regarding Mike's previous parties, we would be remiss if we didn't take ourselves to task for referring to ourselves in the plural. We would also be remiss if we failed to take a moment to celebrate a few of the more memorable events in Mike's WrestleMania party history.

- 1990 – The first ever WrestleMania party guests straggle in off the street knowing only that there is an open door, and that something inside smells vaguely like soup. They will soon become a piece of WrestleMania party legend, as one year later, all four original guests are still unaccounted for, and eventually all are declared legally “had an affair with a married Congressman” missing.
- 1994 – There's not a dry eye or seat in the house as all party guests share a hug and a Burl Ives song after The Macho Man Randy Savage finally breaks down and admits that Adam Bomb has the longer inseam.
- 1997 – Pure joy, bliss, rapture, tranquility, delight, ecstasy, and serenity are bestowed upon those who eat the mystery mushroom appetizers.
- 2000 – 14 guests come down with temporary color blindness for reasons that to this day baffle the medical experts
- 2002 – Good friends, good food, good frolic, good fantasies, good other “f” words. It was like Carnival in Rio de Janeiro, Mardi Gras in New Orleans, and Salisbury Steak night at Folsom Prison all rolled into one!

## Chapter 3

# This Year's WrestleMania XIX Party



As mentioned earlier in this book, Mike McNulty is hosting a WrestleMania XIX party on **Sunday, March 30<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m.** His address is **98.6 Averagetemperature Street in San Francisco**, and his phone number is **109-901-6969**. So if I already told you this once, why did I repeat it again here? Mostly just to hear myself type, as I find that the “click, click, click” sound is one of the most soothing ones around (next to “Today we’re going to loosen these straps a little and see if you’re okay with that”).

This chapter will let you in on the “insider’s” secrets about how the professional WrestleMania party-goers and party-throwers live the high life. Follow these tips, and you too will be the envy of all who spoon-feed you.

## Arrival Time



This is one of the most overlooked aspects of being a WrestleMania party guest. The first match starts at 5:00, and the last match is expected to end around 9:00. But since the host is usually still picking out just which mauve outfit to wear right up until the last moment, arriving any earlier than, say, 4:45 really puts his bacon in a bind (whatever that means).

However, if you arrive early with an expensive gift, his bacon unbinds and blossoms for the rest of the night. And who wouldn’t want to see Mike’s bacon unblossomed? (Oh yeah?! Well you’re in the minority, I assure you!)



So since you now know that the party goes from about 5:00 until 9:00, you would think that you have a good 4-hour cushion of when you could show up? Right? **WRONG!** For if experience has shown us anything, it is that you have already stopped reading this invitation by now, and also that by one hour into the party, not only are all the choice seats and floor spaces by the television already taken, but so are the counter spaces and most of the bedroom, porch, and kitchen standing room areas as well. In fact, for some odd reason, more of the non-television-viewing area is usually filled up first. And along with floor space, the eats and drinks are usually all pawed over almost immediately, too.

So what is the solution? Arrive around 5:30 at the latest, thereby fulfilling the professional WrestleMania party guest manifesto of being fashionably late, but also assuring yourself a shot at some eating and drinking. And while it has never happened at a WrestleMania party before, there's always a first time that you can even assure yourself a shot at some merrying.

But if you must arrive later (or earlier), of course you will be graciously welcomed and pointed at just like everyone else.

## Should I Bring Anything?

Mike always has enough beer, wine, soda, munchies, veggies, desserts, fishes, and loaves on hand to feed the masses. But it his self-proclaimed “world-famous jambalaya” that he is most proud of. And after living for 47 years, to be most proud of that really says something about how he's lived his life, don't you think?



So you are under absolutely no obligation at all to bring anything, and if you don't, there will still be plenty at the party for you and others to enjoy. In fact, every year, Mike ends up sneaking food and drink into guests' clothes as they leave. After all, even a WrestleMania party host can only eat and drink so many leftovers over the next year. So you really do not have to go out of your way to bring anything edible, other than a smile on your lips and a song in your heart!

But if you feel that you just **MUST** bring something, please make it this – bring a friend! I can't tell you how warm it makes me feel to know that somebody is at the party being exposed to WrestleMania for the first time. I mean, I could tell you – I know the words – but having been sent to “sensitivity training” classes because of using those words in front of strangers, I now prefer not to. But it really is a goose in the heart to watch someone see WrestleMania for the first time. So please do think about bringing some sheltered friend whose sad excuse for “culture” prior to this has only consisted of the ballet, opera, and theatre.

## How To Act



If this is your first WrestleMania party, here are a few suggestions that may make your party-going experience even more pleasurable. And for those of you who have attended in the past, a refresher course never hurts, now does it? (At least, that's what I'm told every month by my Anger Management Seminar counselor.) Because let's face it; the last thing you want to do is be caught in a WrestleMania party social faux pas that ensures that you will not be invited to the post-WrestleMania Party Formal Cotillion Ball.

So please pay attention to these suggestions. For if we can't act civilized at a WrestleMania party, we're no more than common animals. And not the cute animals like rats and warthogs, either, but those creepy animals like kitties and bunnies.

- Take a moment to explain to someone how the referee could have possibly missed seeing one wrestler hitting the other with an Oldsmobile.
- Have fun.

## Hosting A WrestleMania Party



Experienced WrestleMania party hosts realize that, behind the appearance of sophistication, panache, and omnipotence that naturally associates itself with such an esteemed position, there is always something new to learn. For that reason, here are some tips to keep in mind when hosting a WrestleMania party.

And these tips are not only for the chosen few hosts of today, but also for the lucky few guests who will one day graduate into the upper echelon of society and host their own Grande Dame of Sports Entertainment parties. Remember, today a WrestleMania party guest; tomorrow a WrestleMania party host; the day after tomorrow, a member of the Federal Witness Relocation Program.

- In California, it is not a felony to “inadvertently” add too much grain alcohol to the punch.
- Raining or not, it's perfectly acceptable to ask someone you don't really like to walk down to the store and get a bag of chips you don't really need.
- The standard seating arrangement near the television set is boy, boy, boy, boy, boy, boy, boy, boy, girl, boy, boy, boy, embarrassed mother, boy, boy, boy, boy, drunken girl, boy, boy, boy, boy, boy, boy, girl who will never talk to the boy who brought her again, boy, boy, boy, boy who brought her, boy, boy.

## Chapter 4

# The Aftermath



To paraphrase Yogi Berra's famous quote (no, not the "Fifty dollars, and you're just using your hand?!" quote – the other one), the WrestleMania party experience ain't over when it's over. Moments after you walk out that front door after the final match of WrestleMania XIX, you will suddenly be hit with a chilling thought: "It's all over! I can't believe it, but it's all over!" Some people tell tales of experiencing weak knees, watery eyes, upset stomachs, hysterical pregnancies, and WMPPTSS (WrestleMania Party Post Traumatic Stress Syndrome) for weeks and even months afterwards. This is perfectly normal and should be expected after the emotional events that a large majority of party guests have just lived through. But there are ways to make the ensuing days easier to endure.

## Visits To Your "Friend"

Let's face it; you've just barely survived a frighteningly emotional experience that may well leave you scarred for the rest of your shortened life. You had better get your fractured psyche and soul some psychiatric help ASAP!!!! (NOTE FROM EDITOR: No doubt that's all true, but it may be slightly harsh for an introductory sentence. How about if you rewrite it like this? "The party is finally over. Don't you want to share the joys you've just experienced with highly educated professional people? Sure you do!")



Some people swear that seeing a psychiatrist has really helped them overcome their WMPPTSS so much that they totally forget how bad it is and return year after year for more WrestleMania party shenanigans. Good for them (and the mood-blocking drugs they are obviously on), but be aware that seeing a psychiatrist is not for everyone. Those of us (I mean, those of you) who have been under constant psychiatric watch for years can testify to the fact that not only is discussing what happened behind Mike's closed doors too ugly and painful to dredge up, but you know that the shrink just goes out and laughs at you with his buddies at the bowling alley over a dozen Budweisers.
